WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED ON CAMPUS?

Paper: (Clean & Dry)

Newspaper, Magazines, Phonebooks, Old Mail, Greeting Cards, Flyers, Brochures, Catalogues, Folders, Old Financial Statements, Paper Bags Soft Cover Books.

Paperboard: (Mixed with Paper)

Cereal, Rice, Cracker, Pasta, Shoe Boxes Paper Towel Rolls, Writing Pad Backs Food and Pizza Boxes (discard liners)

Does it tear? Is it clean? Then recycle it...

Containers:



Plastic: PETE & HDPE Plastics ▪ Soft Drinks and Liquor Bottles ▪ Milk, Water, and Juice Containers ▪ Laundry, Bleach, and Cleaning Containers.

Glass: Clear, Brown, Green and Blue Glass ▪ Food and Beverage Containers ▪ Ceramic Cups and Plates ▪ Drinking Glasses.

Metals: Aluminum Cans (Soft Drink, Juice and other Beverage Cans) ▪ Steel (Tin, Soup Cans, and Metal Jar Lids) ▪ Aluminum Pie Tins and Foil ▪ Aerosol Cans (EMPTY) (Non-Paint or pesticide).

Corrugated Cardboard:

Any Clean Broken-Down "Waffled" Cardboard Box.

Non-Acceptable

WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED ON CAMPUS?

Paper:

Waxed Paper, Soiled Paper, Used Tissues, Plastic, Wood or Metal, Dirt or Other Trash Plastic Bags

Containers:

Plastic: Plastic Grocery Bags, Sandwich Bags ▪ 5 Gallon Pails Lids and Caps ▪ Plastic Silverware ▪ Needles ▪ Brittle Dairy Food Containers ▪ No Container that Previously Held a Hazardous Material.

Glass: Heat Resistant Ovenware ▪ Light Bulbs ▪ Mirror and Windowpane Glass.

Metals: Paint Cans, Gas Cans, or any container that had previously contained a hazardous or toxic material.

Packaging:

Waxed cardboard or styrofoam
